Yindyamarra (Indyamarra), is a powerful value of respect; to be gentle, polite, honour and do slowly. It is the heart of our way of being and doing. Wiradjuri Law demands that we have profound respect for each other, and we do things slowly and with care.

As Aboriginal people we are drawn to the river, Milawa (Murray River). The Milawa is an old man of our lore, telling a thousand stories. Milawa connects us to our cousins up and down its 2,400 km chronicle.

The sculptures along the Yindyamarra Sculpture Walk resonate with the Milawa lore. The Milawa holds our history and inspires our cultural practices. We ask that you respect the sculptures and do not climb on them.

The Crossing Place Trail

The Crossing Place Trail follows the mighty Murray River along a 5.1km loop. Inviting you to pause and soak in the breathtaking vistas that have seen centuries of change. Discover original river crossings used until 1848 when a punt was constructed. In 1861, the first bridge marked history, yet the original crossings remained the preferred cattle route to evade tolls.

Be captivated by the sculptural works of local First Nations artists. Unearth the tale of Yarre the Mailman. Spot a scar tree. And delve into the importance of the billabong environment for First Nations communities. Look out for wildlife like platypus, dunnarts, water rats, and rare black-billed spoonbills.
