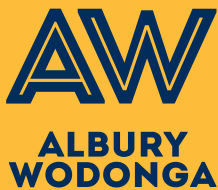
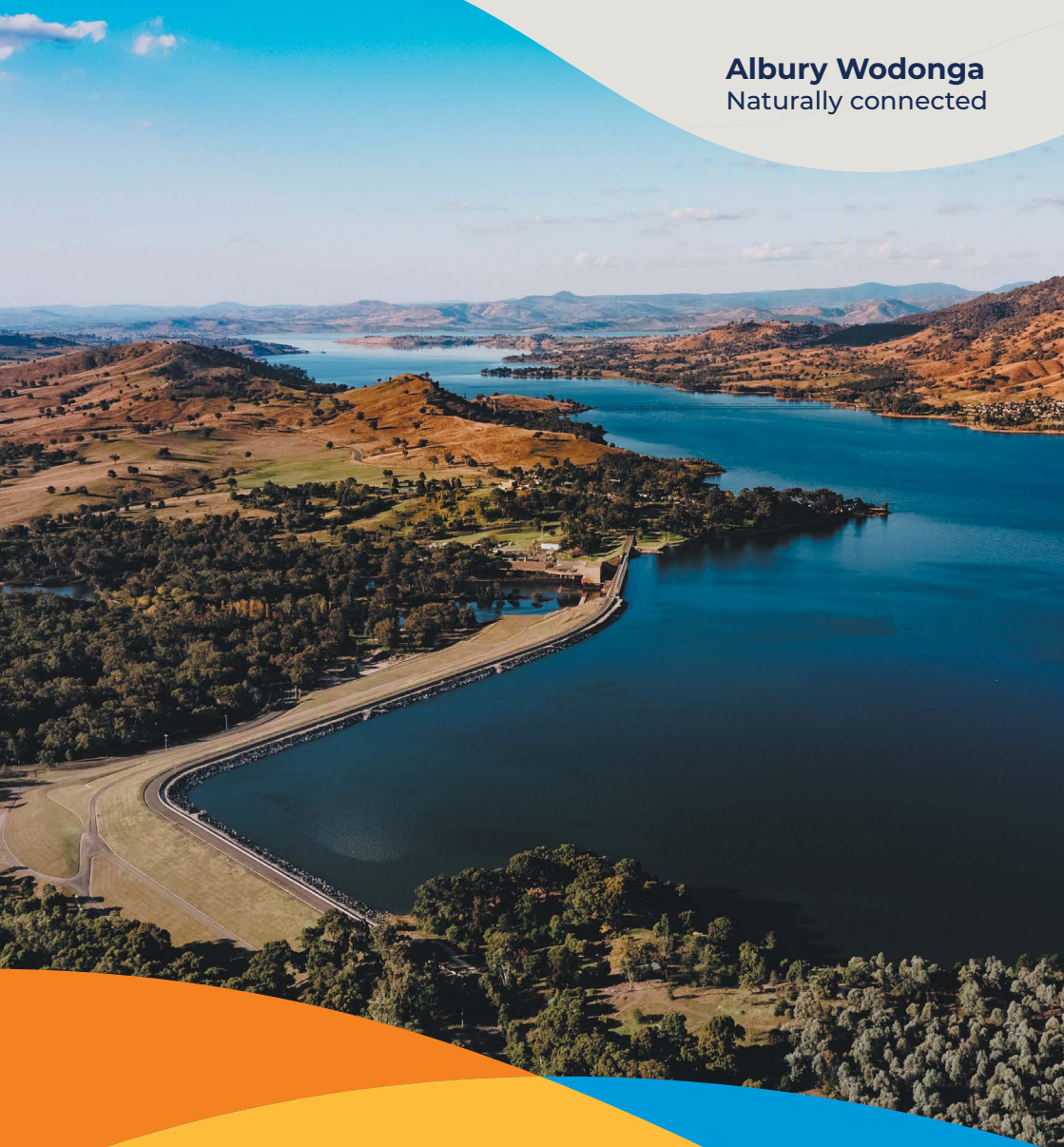

For The Naturally Curious

From the banks of Australia's longest river to the hills that embrace our cities, there's something for every outdoorsy soul to explore here. It's also the perfect spot to set up as your base for snow season, with shuttles to the mountains leaving daily.



Pick your pace

There are over 100 kilometres of tracks and trails to discover across our two cities.

Nail Can Hill features spectacular views from a network of trails ideal for bush walks, running and mountain bike riding.

For a walk with more than one type of view, follow the **Crossing Place Trail**, a 5.1 kilometre loop offering riverside vistas of the Murray, dotted with sculptures by Indigenous artists.

There's more native flora and fauna at **McFarlanes Hill** to discover, where walking tracks take you over rolling hills and alongside clear streams.

Pack your bike for one of Victoria's most picturesque rail trails. **The High Country Rail Trail** skirts the foreshore of Lake Hume for 30 kilometres. Take a break at the Insta-worthy **Sandy Creek Bridge** and viewing platform.



On the water

The **Murray River** is a year-round playground for everyone from anglers to art fans.

Try your luck catching a famous Murray Cod or get up close and personal with Australia's longest river from the newly developed **Murray River Precinct** boardwalks, then follow the river downstream along the **Yindymarra Sculpture Trail** where imposing artworks tell ancient Aboriginal stories.

Holding six times the volume of Sydney Harbour, **Lake Hume** is a famous and photogenic landmark an easy 15 minutes from the cities. Take in the view from the iconic **Hume Dam Wall**.



A walk in the park

Whether you're packing a picnic or looking for somewhere to let the kids run free, we know just the place...

Located in Albury's main street, the **Albury Botanic Gardens** have enchanted visitors for over 145 years. The **Children's Garden** within is always a popular visit, with life-sized dinosaurs, a fairy temple, troll's cave and lots of activities to spark the imagination.

Walk or run, let the dogs off the leash at the dog park, fire up the barbecue. The open spaces of **Belvoir Park** will keep everyone entertained, especially little ones with an epic playground including an accessible **liberty swing**.

Hyphen-Wodonga Library Gallery is another cultural hub for visitors to love and explore, connecting creativity and curiosity in an accessible environment.

The award-winning **Albury LibraryMuseum** rewards visitors with intriguing architecture, exhibitions, and events.



For more art of the performance persuasion, head over to the **HotHouse Theatre** - one of regional Australia's last remaining professional theatre companies.

You'll find the brightest and boldest local and national artists in a space dedicated to the diversity of the region.



Hear our stories

Go your own way with the **Albury CBD Historic Buildings Walking Tour** or take a step back in time to the 1870s at the **Jindera Pioneer Museum**.

Bonegilla Migrant Experience pays homage to the region's post-WWII immigrants. Tour the remaining buildings and curated installations for insight into the struggles and triumphs of the 300,000+ individuals who passed through Bonegilla between 1947 and 1971.



Savor a regional favourite

Albury Wodonga is at the centre of an abundant food bowl with something for everyone's tastebuds. Start your day with brunch and a view of the autumn leaves at **Canvas Eatery**, or discover some of the locals' favourites at **Beanstation** in the historic former Wodonga Railway Station. For a wintery treat, head to **Yardbird**, where the best of the season's produce is cooked over fire. Feel like part of the family at **La Maison**, where seasonal dishes are served with warm hospitality.

For a before or after dinner tippie, settle in to a Chesterfield by the cosy open fire at quirky **Two Fingers Whiskey Bar**.

At the heart of Wodonga's CBD, you'll find **The Cube Wodonga** – an entertainment hub showcasing live theatre, music, comedy, circus, and more.

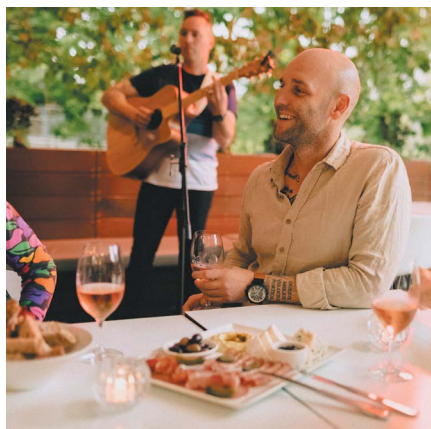
National and international stars take the stage at the **Albury Entertainment Centre**, where you can enjoy everything from comedy to music, to kid-friendly performances.
