Albury Botanic Gardens	Cnr Dean Street & Wodonga Place, Albury 02 6023 8111 Open daily 6.30am-7.00pm	Explore the 1000 plus native and exotic plants, enjoy a picnic on the lawn, visit the dinosaurs and fairy castle in the Children's Garden. (please note Children's Garden is closed Wednesdays for maintenance).
Albury CBD Walking Tour	Download the app or grab a map from Albury Visitor Information Centre 1300 252 879	The tour showcases 21 sites spread over 13 locations along Albury's Smollett and Dean Streets. Bollards mark the stopping points, and a brief description of each individual landmark is provided.
Albury LibraryMuseum	Cnr Swift & Kiewa Streets, Albury Mon, Wed & Thu 10.00am-7.00pm Tues & Fri 10.00am-5.00pm Sat 10.00am-3.00pm Sun 10.00pm-2.00pm	View The Crossing Place and The Bonegilla Story, permanent exhibitions that provide insight into Albury's past. Touring exhibitions feature in the front and laneway galleries.
Albury War Memorial	Memorial Drive, Albury	Opened on Anzac Day 1925, the simple but striking design is topped with a 'torch of liberty' and faced with 40 panes of prismatic glass. Admire the view from the lookout at Monument Hill.
Belvoir Park	Huon Street, Wodonga	This playground paradise caters to all ages with something for everyone. Featuring a ninja obstacle course, liberty swing and playground for smaller children. Take a walk around the lake, dogs can run free in the off-leash area.
Eastern Hill Reserve	East Street, Albury	Lookout boasting panoramic views of Table Top ranges, Lake Hume and spillway, and the Murray River winding through Mungabareena Reserve. Follow part of the Hume and Hovell walking track which runs behind the radio towers for views towards the Victorian Alps.
Gateway Gallery	Lincoln Causeway, Wodonga Tues – Sat: 10.00am-4.00pm	Gateway Gallery is a volunteer artist run gallery, selling and exhibiting diverse, original art created by local artists.

High Country Rail Trail	From Wodonga city centre to Shelley station	Over 80 kms of trail stretches from Wodonga, through old Tallangatta, and out to Shelley. Featuring scenic landscapes, rest stops and historical sites, cyclists and walkers can explore diverse landscapes all year round.
Huon Hill Parklands	Whytes Road, Wodonga 02 6023 6714	At 428 metres above sea level, Huon Hill lookout provides sensational views across the Kiewa Valley, the Victorian alpine region, Lake Hume and the cities of Albury and Wodonga.
Hyphen – Wodonga Library Gallery	Hovell Street, Wodonga 02 6022 9330 Mon-Fri 10.00am-6.00pm Sat-Sun 10.00am-3.00pm	Wodonga’s newest community space is the city’s cultural hub, a state-of-the-art facility nurturing creativity, connection and curiosity. Come explore where art and literature meet.
Junction Place	Elgin Boulevard, Wodonga	An exciting urban space bringing new life to the historic railway station with local boutique food operators and hosts to local markets and events.
Lake Hume and Hume Dam Wall	Riverina Highway, Lake Hume	Six times the size of Sydney Harbour, this is a must-do. Fish, swim, paddle, or relax. Take a walk across the top of the Dam Wall for panoramic views of Lake Hume and the Murray River. Plenty of picnic spots and amenities
Murray Art Museum Albury (MAMA)	Dean Street, Albury Mon-Fri 10.00am-5.00pm Sat-Sun 10.00am-4.00pm	MAMA is a contemporary art experience balancing international exhibitions with deep connections to our region and cultural identity.
Murray River Precinct	Wodonga Place, Albury	An inclusive boardwalk stretching from Hovell Tree Park to Bungambrawatha Creek. Featuring a jetty, floating dock, viewing platforms, picnic areas, shade and accessible pathways for walking and cycling.
Nail Can Hill	Various access points in West Albury, Grab a map from Albury Visitor Information Centre.	Nail Can Hill parklands feature wildflowers in spring, great views and flora secrets such as the critically endangered Spider Orchid. Single-track trails cater to those on two feet or two wheels.
Noreuil Park	Wodonga Place, Albury	A haven for relaxation and recreation. Ample shade, picnic tables and grassy areas provide space for families and friends to gather. Enjoy a picnic, paddle or swim in the river.
Oddies Creek Adventure Playspace	Oddies Creek Park (off Wodonga Place), Albury	Located among gum trees, the 2,000-square-metre fully fenced Oddies Creek Adventure Playspace is for children of all abilities.
Public Art Trail	Visit ‘Albury Wodonga Public Art Trail Map’ online	Discover sculptures, murals, and wrapped infrastructure across many sites in Albury Wodonga.
Skate parks	Albury Skate Park James Scott Skate Park Baranduda Bowl	Catering to riders of all levels the skate parks offer features for scooters, BMXs and roller skating. There are street-style elements and seating areas, some parks offer basketball courts and a parkour course.



The Crossing Place Trail	Lemke Road, Gateway Island, Wodonga	The 5.1km trail follows the Murray River. The trail features sculptures by local artists and interpretive signage highlights the area's cultural significance.
Yindyamarra Sculpture Walk	Kremur Street, Albury	A 5km loop featuring fourteen sculptures made by local Indigenous artists, featuring interpretive signs and smart-phone accessible videos.
Wagirra Trail	Noreuil Park, Hovell Tree Park, Padman Park, Kremur Street to Wonga Wetlands.	An 8.5km shared sealed pathway meandering through riverside parks from Noreuil Park through to Wonga Wetlands. This trail includes the (5.3km) Yindyamarra Sculpture Walk.
Wonga Wetlands	Riverina Highway (the road to Howlong and Corowa), Albury Open daily 7.30am-7.30pm	An ecosystem of lagoons and billabongs, discover a haven for wildlife, birdwatchers, photographers, bushwalkers and families.
